5. Sachin Tendulkar is one of the greatest batsman in One Day International and second only to Don Bradman in the all time greatest list in Test cricket. He was a part of the 2011 Cricket world cup winning Indian team. He was also the recipient of 'Player of the Tournament' award of the 2003 Cricket world cup held in South Africa.

He won the 2010 Sir Garfield Sobers Trophy for cricketer of the year at the ICC awards. He passed 30,000 runs in international cricket on 20th November 2009. On 5th December 2012, he became first batsman in history to cross the 34,000 runs aggregate in all formats of the game put together. At 36 years and 306 days, he became the first ever player to score a double century in the history of ODI's. Two years later he became the first player to score 100 international centuries. As of June 2013, he has played 662 matches in international cricket.

The lake remains fairly shallow even during heavy rains, and gets dry easily in times to severe drought.
- Udaipur Solar Observatory** - Asia's only solar observatory, the Udaipur solar Observatory is situated on an island in the middle of the Lake Fateh Sagar.
  - Sukhadia Circle** - Sukhadia Circle (square) is a large roundabout in the city's northern suburb of panchwati, on the road of Ranakpur and Mt. Abu. The circle is a popular recreational centre and meeting place.
  - Sahelion ki Bari** : It was laid for a group of forty-eight young women attendants who accompanied a princess to Udaipur as part of her dowry. The gardens set below the embankment of the Fateh Sagar Lake have lotus pools, marble pavilions and elephant shaped fountains.
